DIAMONDVILLE

BUILT ON COAL AND COMMUNITY, DIAMONDVILLE HONORS ITS MINING HERITAGE WHILE PRESERVING THE VALUES THAT CONTINUE TO SHAPE THE TOWN TODAY.



Diamondville was established in 1896 as a coal mining town, one year before the founding of nearby Kemmerer. The town developed around coal operations in the Diamond Mountain area, with mining serving as the primary economic driver during its early years. Like many communities of the time, Diamondville grew quickly to support miners and their families, with housing, schools, churches, and small businesses forming around the mines.

Coal production played a significant role in supplying fuel to the region and supporting railroad expansion throughout southwestern Wyoming. Diamondville's workforce and infrastructure were closely tied to the mining industry, and the town experienced periods of growth and hardship as coal demand fluctuated.

In 1910, Diamondville was officially incorporated, and in 1911 it was designated the county seat of Lincoln County. However, that designation was later transferred to Kemmerer, reflecting the region's shifting commercial and administrative center.

Over time, Diamondville evolved beyond its mining origins. While coal remains an important part of its history, the town has developed its own identity as a close-knit residential community with deep ties to the area's industrial heritage. Today, Diamondville stands as an enduring reminder of the role coal mining played in shaping Lincoln County and the communities of southwestern Wyoming.

KEMMERER

WITH DEEP ROOTS IN COAL AND FOSSILS, KEMMERER STRIVES TO KEEP THE RICH HISTORY OF THEIR PAST ALIVE FOR MANY GENERATIONS TO COME.



Kemmerer was founded in 1897 by Patrick J. Quealy following the formation of the Kemmerer Coal Company. The town was named for Mahlon S. Kemmerer, a Pennsylvania coal capitalist who provided financial backing for the operation and later became Quealy's business partner. From the beginning, Kemmerer was established as an independent town, where land was sold rather than leased by the coal company. This allowed private businesses and financial institutions to develop alongside the mines. Coal mining and railroads drove Kemmerer's early growth. Kemmerer's connections to regional rail lines supported coal transport and helped establish the town as a center of commerce. In 1900, the First National Bank of Kemmerer opened, followed by the Kemmerer Savings Bank in 1909, reflecting the community's growing economic stability. Kemmerer later became the county seat of Lincoln County.

Downtown developed as the heart of civic and social life. The Kemmerer Hotel, built between 1897 and 1898 from locally quarried stone, served as a gathering place for business and community events and hosted the town's first council meeting following incorporation on February 28, 1899. Though demolished in 2004 due to structural concerns, the hotel remains an important part of Kemmerer's story.

Kemmerer is also closely linked to Fossil Butte National Monument, one of the world's most significant fossil locations. Part of the ancient Green River Lake System, Fossil Butte preserves exceptionally detailed fossils dating back more than 50 million years. Recognized for its scientific value in the late 19th century, the site was protected as a national monument in 1972.

Today, Kemmerer's history reflects a balance of industry, independence, and discovery, shaping the community that continues to serve as a regional center in southwestern Wyoming.

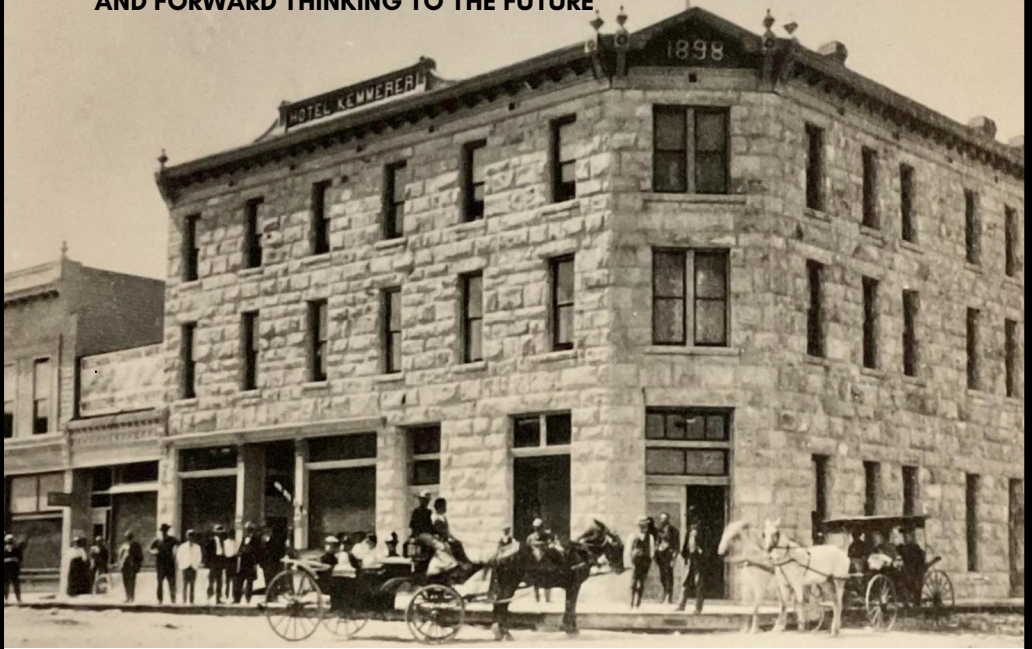

JC PENNEY MOTHER STORE

STEP INSIDE A LIVING PIECE OF AMERICAN RETAIL HISTORY



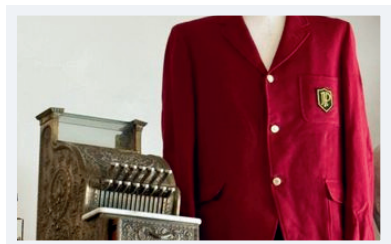
James Cash Penney got his start in retail when he purchased a butcher shop in Longmont, Colorado. When a major customer required a kickback in the form of bourbon, Penney refused. This led to the account being withdrawn and Penney's business failing. But in 1898, Penney went to work for Thomas M. Callahn and William Guy Johnons of Fort Collins. These gentlemen operated a small chain of stores known as "Golden Rule Stores". Penney was assigned to the company's store in Evanston. When Penney proved himself to be a success, he was offered the opportunity to become a partner in the new Golden Rule store in Ogden, Utah. When he declined Ogden, he pitched the idea of opening a store in Kemmerer.

So on April 14, 1902, the new Kemmerer "Golden Rule Store" was opened. At the time, Penney and his wife were required to live in the attic above the store. But do to the success of the store, the couple was able to purchase a modest cottage on the edge of the commercial district.

In 1907, after proving so much success, Penney was given the opportunity to buy the Kemmerer store, as well as two other stores. With continued success and to be closer to supplies, Penney moved to Salt Lake City, and later on to New York.

The current location of the J.C. Penney store is the third location of the store, which opened in 1929.

The cottage found its current destination in the triangle in the 1970's. in 1976, it was added the National Register of Historic Places.



Step inside to discover pieces of retail history, from vintage fixtures to the original cash carrier—an overhead pulley system that transported money from each register to the office above the store

JC PENNEY HOME & MUSEUM

STEP INSIDE A LIVING PIECE OF AMERICAN RETAIL HISTORY



Just east of Triangle Park stands J.C. Penney's original Kemmerer home, where he lived with his wife, Berta, and their children from 1904 to 1909. This modest house—now open for visitors—offers a rare glimpse into early 20th-century life, complete with period furnishings and authentic artifacts from Penney's time. Lacking electricity or running water, the home relied on a wood-burning stove for warmth and cooking, and much of its furniture was handmade from wooden shipping crates used by the Golden Rule Store. Inside, visitors can see the attic bedroom where Penney once slept and learn how he safeguarded his daily earnings beneath a hidden floorboard after long days at the store. Preserved in a warm, Americana style, the home reflects the humility, resourcefulness, and values of fairness and service that shaped both Penney's life and one of America's most enduring retail brands.

Stop #5: The Current J.C. Penney Store



Did you know the J.C. Penney company is one of the oldest continuously operating retail stores in America? It started right here in Kemmerer!



Look at the windows of the store. Imagine what kinds of displays might have been set up here to catch people's attention in the early days. Describe something you think would have been displayed.

Stop #1: Chamber of Commerce Cabin



Each Lightbulb designates Historic Facts to read at each stop

The unique triangular shape of Kemmerer's Triangle Park was designed to guide traffic and welcome visitors. In the early 1900s, it was the first sight for those disembarking trains, with its design helping pedestrian flow move smoothly from the train depot into town.



Each Penney indicates interactive questions for engagement

Imagine it's the early 1900s, and you're traveling to Kemmerer by train. What do you think it would have been like? What sounds would you hear? What would you see around the park as people arrived? Think about one thing you think people might have brought with them or one thing they might have seen here."



Stop #2: James Cash Penney Statue



Did you know J.C. Penney's first job earned him just \$2.27 a month? He believed in saving and hard work, and those principles shaped his success.



Look closely at the statue. What do you notice about J.C. Penney's pose or expression? Imagine what it says about the kind of person he was. Think about a word that would describe him based on what you've learned.



Stop #6: Original J.C. Penney Store/First Bank of Kemmerer

Did you know that J.C. Penney didn't just build a retail empire? He also established this bank to provide financial services for the people of Kemmerer, supporting local businesses and families.

Think about what it would have been like to live in the attic above the Golden Rule Store. What would you have done to stay warm or cook meals? Think about one thing you think the Penneys needed to make their home comfortable.



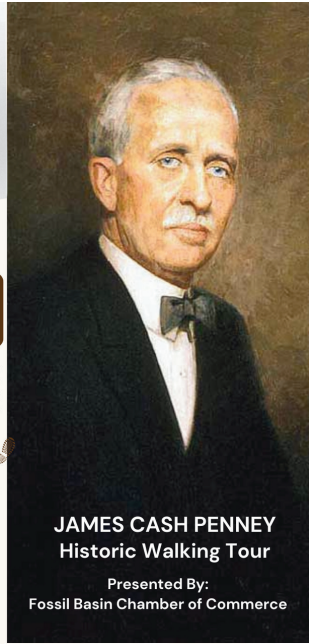
Stop #3: The Golden Rule Store

Did you know the Golden Rule Store's name came from Penney's belief in treating others how he wanted to be treated? He often said, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you."

Take a moment to imagine stepping into this store in 1902. What might you have purchased? Look around—can you find any clues about what life was like back then? Think about one item you think people needed most.

Interesting J.C. Penney Facts

- **A Legacy of Giving** – J.C. Penney believed in giving back, donating much of his wealth to charities, schools, and agricultural programs through the J.C. Penney Foundation.
- **Employee Profit Sharing** – Penney was one of the first business owners to offer profit-sharing, believing employees should benefit from the store's success.
- **Faith and Perseverance** – Raised in a devout Baptist family, Penney relied on his faith, especially during the Great Depression, to rebuild his fortune.
- **Passion for Farming** – Before retail, Penney dreamed of being a farmer. Later, he invested in cattle breeding and supported sustainable farming.
- **A Long Life and Legacy** – Penney lived to be 95, witnessing his single store grow into a national retail empire while staying active in business.

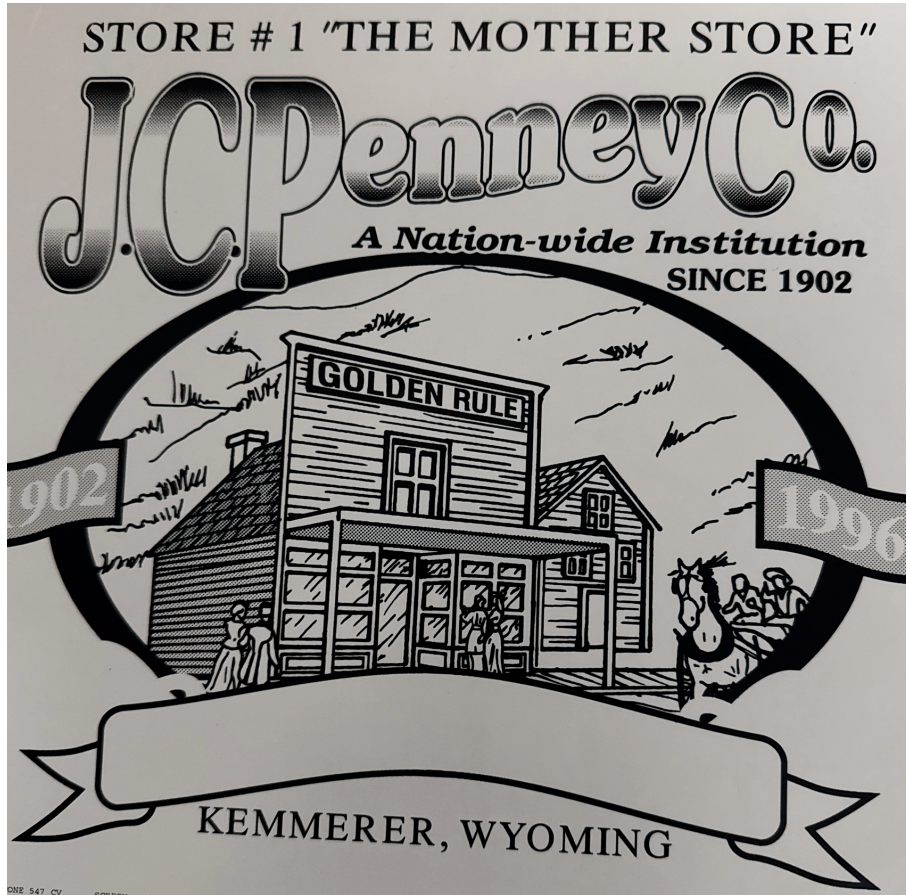

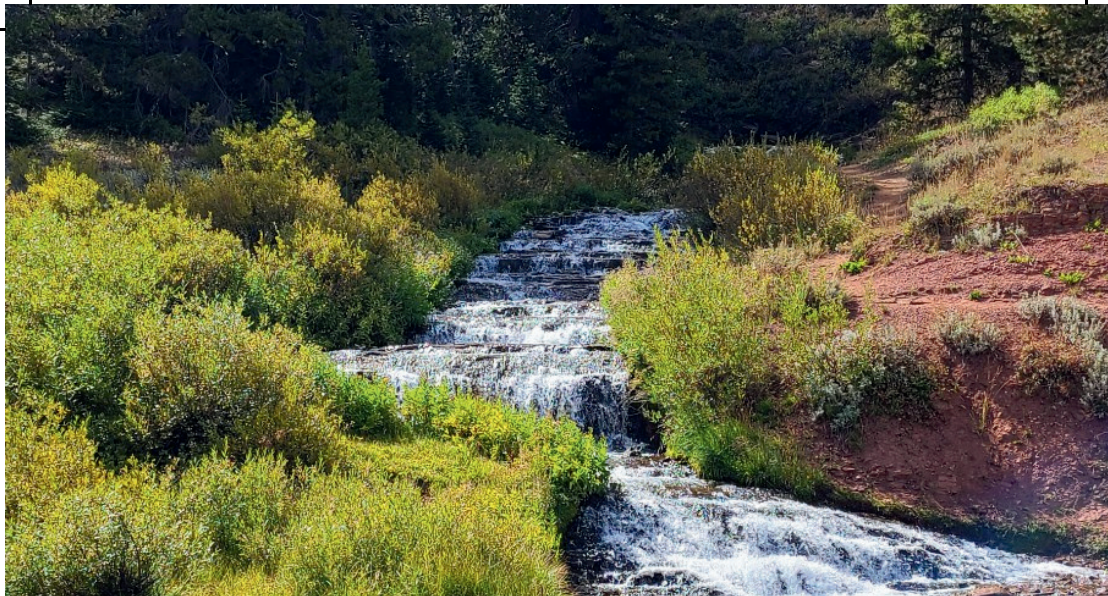

Lions Club Park & Walking Trail

North of Kemmerer between SR-233 and US-189. Pavilion, trails, and a river bridge.

Dempsey Road

Four miles north. Leads to public lands, Oregon Trail viewpoints, Pioneer Graves, Nancy Hill, and fossil areas.

Kemmerer Reservoir

Thirteen miles north. Year-round fishing for rainbow trout. Non-motorized boat ramp on the east side.

Lake Viva Naughton

Dam: Fourteen miles north with lake access.

Marina: Fifteen miles north with two boat ramps.

Upper Viva Naughton: Seventeen miles north across from Dempsey Point.

Dempsey Point

Twenty miles north with a boat ramp and six campsites.

Snowmobile Area

Twenty-two miles north of Kemmerer.

Elk Creek Ranger Station

Thirty-six miles north on USFS Road 1062. A preserved 1914 ranger station.

BIG SPRING SCENIC BACKWAY

Hams Fork Campground

Located 37 miles north of Kemmerer on USFS 10622. This B-site campground is east of the Hams Fork River and features restrooms and potable water. A nightly usage fee applies for camping.

The Big Spring

Situated 44 miles north of Kemmerer on USFS 10062. The parking lot and access road are east of West Hams Fork Creek, with the spring and picnic area to the west. A trail and bridge connect these areas.

Lake Alice Access

Found 21 miles from Cokeville on the east side of USFS Road 10062. It is the largest natural lake in B-TNF. The junction with Hobbie Creek Road/FS-1093 provides access to the Lake Alice trailhead and Hobbie Creek Campground.

Pine Creek Ski Resort Access

Located approximately 35 miles north of Cokeville on the east side of SR-232. This area provides access to both the Pine Creek Ski Resort and BLM campgrounds.

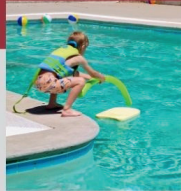

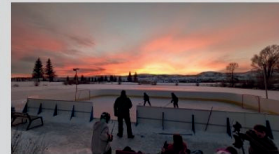

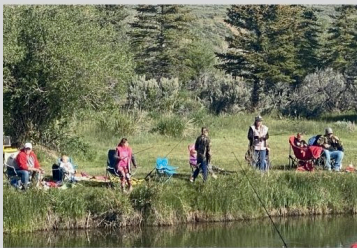

Chicken Creek Loup Trail

The 1.3-mile trail is located in the Fossil Butte National Monument area. The trail crosses Chicken Creek and is a great, short, day hike.

Hamsfork Recreation Trail

Located next to Kemmerer Fishing Pond.
Paved, multi-use, 1.25-mile trail.
Bikes permitted.
No motorized vehicles

Historic Quarry Trail

2.5-mile loop trail located in the Fossil Butte National Monument area. Trail passes through parts of the Wasatch and Green River Formations. Considered moderate to strenuous depending on how acclimated one is to the elevation. This trail is not accessible to wheelchairs or strollers.

Lions Club Recreation Trail

Trail head is located in Lions Club Park. Trail ends behind Kemmerer City Hall. Gravel, multi-use, 1.75 miles trail. Bikes permitted.

Viva Naughton Vicinity Map

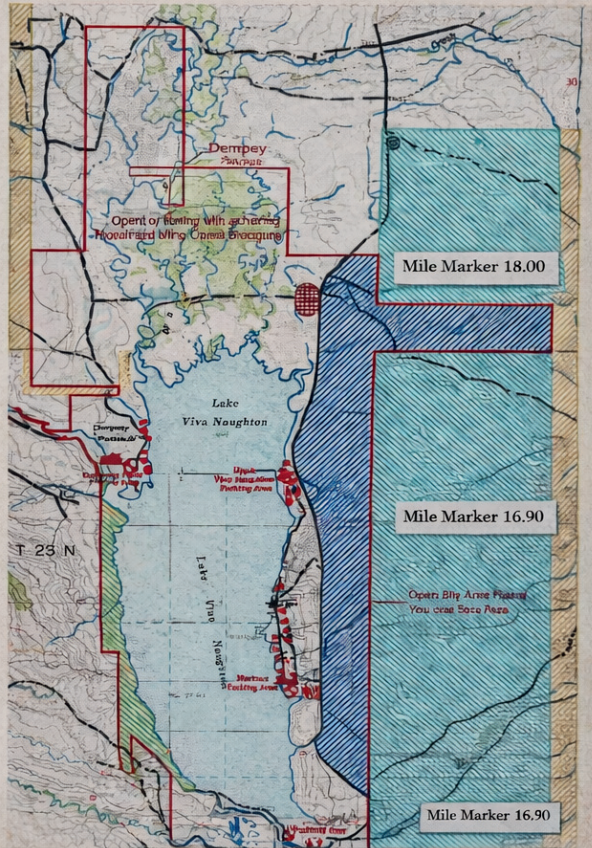

Fossil Butte National Monument

Full of History and Life

What was once a large freshwater lake 52-million years ago, is now Fossil Butte National Monument protecting the life that once called Fossil Lake home. Here lies a story of an ancient environment told through the million fossils of Fossil Lake. Fishes, turtles, and crocodilians swam throughout the lake. Around the lake was a forest inhabited by birds, bats, insects, palms, lizards, small horses, and other mammals.

Explore Fossil Butte

The Nature Trail is a 1.5-mile loop hike with a 350-foot gain in elevation. June and July are a great time to see the wildflowers as you walk through meadows and aspen groves. The Historic Quarry Trail is a 2.5-mile loop gaining 700 feet in elevation. Along the trail are signs detailing the rock layers. Fossils are not visible along this trail as they are sandwiched between the layers of rock. The Scenic Drive is 5.5-miles one way as it takes you to the top of a ridge, where you will have views of the valley below. Part of this drive is graveled and steep. RV's, motorcycles, or any vehicles towing anything are not recommended.

Visitor Center

In the Visitor Center, you can find over 2,000 fossils housed, including 1,400 coprolites throughout the restrooms. The Visitor Center is open 8:00-4:30 daily, except from November-April, when it is closed on Sundays and federal holidays.

Originating from local tribes' word "Sisk-a-dee-agie" meaning "river of the prairie hen", Seedskadee later got its name through fur trappers. Seedskadee is a 26,210-acre refuge that protects a wide variety of riparian, wetland, and upland shrub habitats along 36 miles of the Green River in southwest Wyoming. A wide variety of migratory waterfowl and passerine bird species use the riparian corridor of the Green River as a migration route and nesting area.

The stretch of the Green River that passes through Seedskadee was crossed by thousands of pioneers. The Oregon, Mormon, and California Trails, as well as the Pony Express Route all cross the refuge. Ferries were operated on the Green in the 1840's and by Jim Bridger. Diaries of immigrants have often mentioned the crossing of the river and the difficulties.

Seedskadee National Wildlife Refuge was established in 1965 through the Colorado River Storage Project Act of 1956.



Special Refuge Regulations

The Refuge is open to the public from 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset. Collecting/removing antlers and other natural historical artifacts on the Refuge are prohibited. Vehicle traffic is restricted to designated roads. Limited trapping opportunities may be available on the Refuge by special permit only. Most watercraft will require a purchase of a current Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) decal and may require a mandatory inspection before launching.

Special Fishing Regulations

Fishing on the Green River from the CCC Bridge on County Road 8 (2.5 miles upstream of the northern boundary of the Refuge) to the confluence with the Big Sandy River (5 miles downstream of the Highway 28 bridge) has the following additional State regulations: only artificial flies and lures may be used; creel limit is one trout per day or in possession; all trout less than 20 inches must be released.

Commercial guiding on the Refuge requires a special use permit.

General State creel limits and regulations apply downstream of the Green River's confluence with the Big Sandy River.



Special Hunting Regulations

Become familiar with boundaries of hunting units before going afield. Licensed waterfowl hunters may enter the Refuge 1 hour before legal shooting hours to set up decoys or blinds. Only portable blinds or blinds constructed from dead, downed wood may be used. Cutting of standing live or dead vegetation or digging pit blinds is prohibited. Portable tree stands that do not damage trees are permitted.

People who possess, transport, or carry firearms within the Refuge must comply with all provisions of State law. The discharge of firearms is permitted in accordance with refuge regulations. Federally approved non-toxic shot is required for all shotgun hunting. Off-road vehicle travel is prohibited for game retrieval.

Dogs must be confined or leashed except when game bird hunting.

Ammunition casings are litter.

Commercial guiding for any hunting activity is prohibited.

Use or possession of alcohol while hunting is prohibited.
